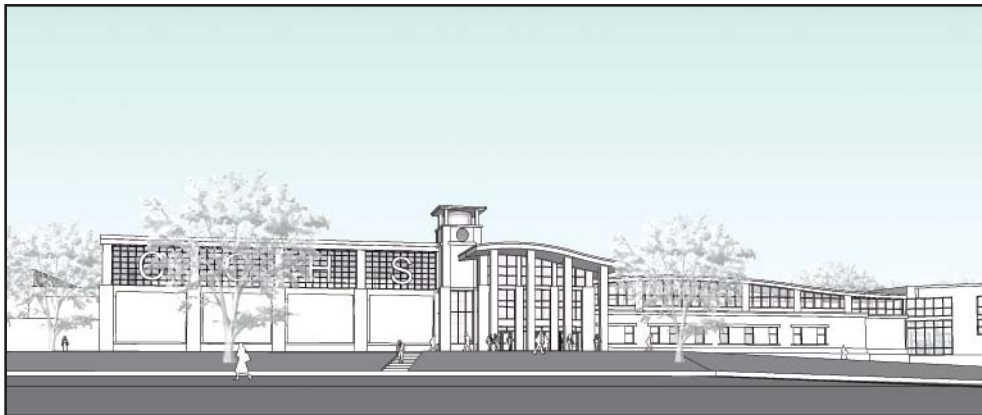

Plans on Target for May 2007 Bond Referendum

Construction throughout the school district has been progressing with the completion of renovations/additions at Bastrop High School and the planning and design work that has taken place with the May 2007 bond referendums.



Board members and district officials reviewed the proposed sketches of Cedar Creek High School. The new school is set to open for the 2010 school year.

Although things seem quiet with regards to school district construction, according to Chief Operations Officer, Henry Gideon, "There's a heck-of-a lot of work going on behind the scenes." Referencing the historic and significant May 12, 2007 bond election, in which voters approved nearly \$98 million in funding for capital improvement and facility projects;

Gideon is reporting that he is satisfied with the flow of work. "We've not started turning dirt at the sites, but we've got our sleeves rolled up around the design tables as we work with our contractors and architects to take the district's design ideas and translate them into an end product

that will enhance learning for our students and make our voters proud!"

Since passage of the 2007 bond referendums to construct a new High School, a Centralized Multi-purpose Athletic Stadium, and a Centralized Multi-purpose Performing Arts

Center, the BISD Board of Trustees and district staff have been directing the district's architects, consultants, and contractors during the initial phases of planning and design work. Gideon further added, "The best way of keeping and maintaining the community's support is simply by being

good stewards of the money we have been entrusted with. After all, building new schools and facilities for students is very expensive and requires sacrifice on the part of the voting public, it is therefore incumbent upon the district staff to be ever vigilant in delivering

CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS TO BE NAMED AFTER THEATRE TEACHER



The Jerry Fay Wilhelm Center for the Performing Arts is scheduled to open during fall 2009. The performing arts center was one of the three approved referendums of the May 2007 bond election.

The center for the performing arts is being named after the late Jerry Fay Wilhelm, former Bastrop ISD theatre teacher. She spent 28 years teaching the

students of Bastrop. She was the first resident theatre teacher and established the theatre arts program in the newly built Bastrop High School in 1969. She directed BHS's UIL One Act Play competition for 27 years. During that time, BHS won district 18 times, advanced to area 16 times, advanced to regionals 15 times, advanced to state 2 times and won the state title in 1978. And the

most amazing feat, she did it all without an auditorium at BISD and on a very minimal budget.

Wilhelm courageously fought cancer, providing inspiration to others with her personality and sense of humor. She dedicated numerous hours to the Bastrop County Chapter of the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life, and was hono-

BASTROP HIGH SCHOOL RECEIVES COLLEGE READINESS RECOGNITION

Bastrop High School has received the "2007 College Readiness" awards from the Texas ACT Council for increasing the number of students taking the ACT Assessment over the past five years and significantly increasing their level of achievement and college readiness. The Texas ACT Council is made up of secondary and postsecondary educators who advise ACT, Inc. on the utilization of ACT programs and services in Texas schools and colleges. ACT, Inc. is the not-for-profit organization that

provides assessment, research, information and program management services in the broad areas of education and workforce development and the publisher of the ACT Assessment. The ACT Assessment is the college admissions test that is accepted by all colleges nationwide.

According to Karen Pennell, ACT Assistant Vice President and Southwest Regional Manager, "The Texas ACT Council wanted to recognize those high schools that have

made significant strides in increasing the college readiness of their graduates as demonstrated by their ACT score increases over the past five years. This can only happen as a result of the high school's staff efforts. Only 79 high schools in Texas were honored for their superior level of accomplishment."

Last school year over 130,000 Texas high school students took the ACT Assessment.

Bears Football Gets New Head Coach for 2008

When the Bastrop Bears football team hits the field this fall, they will be playing under new leadership. Bastrop ISD announced that the Bears will be under the direction of Coach Gerald Perry. Perry comes to Bastrop from Plano East where he was the Offensive Coordinator and Assistant Head Coach since spring 2002.

Perry started his coaching career back in 1993 as a coach for Lorena Middle School and was promoted to the head football/athletic director after his first year. He was also the assistant track and basketball coach during that time. In 1996, he moved to Lake Worth High School in Fort Worth. From 1996-2000, he filled various positions including special teams coordinator, head track coach, offensive coordi-

nator and defensive first assistant. From 2000 to 2002, Perry made the transition to Burleson High School as a passing game coordinator and assistant track coach. Since 2002, he has been at 5A Plano East Senior High.

His offense will bring an uptempo, no huddle, multiple formation game plan, that in

Plano, averaged 437 yards and 36 points a game including throwing for over 3,000 yards. The aggressive defense will include multiple fronts, coverage's and stunts.

Perry will be taking the place of Coach Ron Schroeder, who retired at the end of the 2007 season.

March TAKS Testing Dates Moved

Commissioner of Education Robert Scott announced today that he is adjusting the state testing calendar to ensure that no Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills exams are given on the March 4 primary election day.

"By moving testing dates, we can preserve schools as polling places and maintain a calm, quiet, secure testing environment for our students," Scott said.

The commissioner decided to change the testing calendar after consulting with many superintendents, testing coordinators and education service center directors.

Many schools are used as polling places. For the first time, a testing date and election day coincided because of three changes in the law. Lawmakers moved the March election

day up by one week. Another law pushed the start date for schools back to late August and, because of that change, a third bill required testing to occur two weeks later than it did during the 2006-2007 school year.

When public comment was requested on a draft version of the testing calendar this past summer, none of the comments received expressed a concern about conducting testing on election day. But as election day draws near, some district officials began to worry that the steady influx of voters into their building could be distracting to students taking a high-stakes test.

Under the new calendar, all tests scheduled for March 4-6 will be given one day later than originally scheduled. The exit-level TAKS social studies exam, which was originally

scheduled for March 7, will be moved to March 3.

"We know this change causes additional work for our district and campus testing coordinators so we have not made this decision lightly. We had to balance the long-standing tradition of using schools as polling places with children's right to a quiet testing environment as they take high stakes exams," Scott said.

Some of the tests that were originally scheduled to be given on March 4, determine whether children are promoted to the next grade or whether they will graduate from high school.

While state tests are not normally administered on Monday, the exit-level social studies exam affects the fewest number of test takers, approximately 10,000 students statewide.

HELPFUL TAKS TESTING TIPS

Bastrop school officials want to remind parents that students will begin taking the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills or TAKS beginning March 5.

The tests are important because students in some grades must pass specific tests to be promoted or to graduate — and because the TEA will rate schools based on test results.

TAKS promotion requirements are:

- Third graders must pass Reading to be promoted to fourth grade.
- Fifth graders must pass Reading and Math to be promoted to sixth grade.

•Eighth graders must pass Reading and Math to be promoted to ninth grade.

•Students in eleventh grade must pass all portions — ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies — to graduate.

"Bastrop students are up to the TAKS challenge," Superintendent Roderick Emanuel said. "Students and teachers have been working hard all year. Now we are asking parents to help their children be a 'TAKS success' by doing a few simple things."

• Children should get adequate rest the night before a TAKS test. The National Sleep Foundation — www.sleepfoun-

dation.org — recommends that children up to age 12 get 9-11 hours of sleep each night, and teenagers get nine hours.

• A healthy breakfast helps children focus.

•Children should come to school on TAKS days. Attendance on test dates is critical. TEA requires a test participation rate of 95 percent of students for a school to be in compliance with Texas' accountability system.

"Parents, unless your child is ill, please be sure that he or she attends school on the TAKS test days," Emanuel said. "Please check the TAKS schedule and make note of the dates on which your child will be tested."

quality learning environments on time and within budget.”

According to Superintendent Roderick Emanuel, “It is indeed a team effort to plan, construct, and build facilities and it starts with our Board of Trustees. They hold in trust the responsibilities of land development, and the design and construction of school facilities for the students and taxpayers of BISD. But, it is also the responsibility of district staff and our partners in design and construction, to guide and support the Board by facilitating and managing the tools, people, and resources that will enable our Board to make the best decisions possible in order to successfully execute and deliver quality learning environments.”

Design and Construction Progress Report:

Cedar Creek High School

(located at the intersection of Pope Bend South and SH 71)

• The project design teams made up of a representation of service center staff, curriculum and instruction personnel and teachers have completed the schematic design phase recom-

mendations including site and floor plan layouts.

• The Board of Trustees has hired American Constructors to perform the duties of construction management.

• The Board of Trustees has approved the schematic design work and has authorized the architects to proceed with design development.

• The Board of Trustees has taken action to formally name the new high school—Cedar Creek High School.

• The Board of Trustees is also studying grade configuration scenarios and start-up costs for opening the new high school.

• The Board of Trustees has approved the design committee recommendations for the exterior elevations and the Board has participated in a workshop concerning exterior materials and a selection of possible color palettes.

• Next up for the Board of Trustees is consideration of the design development and review and approval of final design. Centralized Multi-Purpose Stadium

• The Board of Trustees has finalized the purchase of a stadium site located on the east side of SH 21 approximately 2.5 miles south of the intersection of SH 71 and SH 21. This site is approximately 8.5 miles from Bastrop High School, 6.6 miles from the new Cedar Creek High School, and

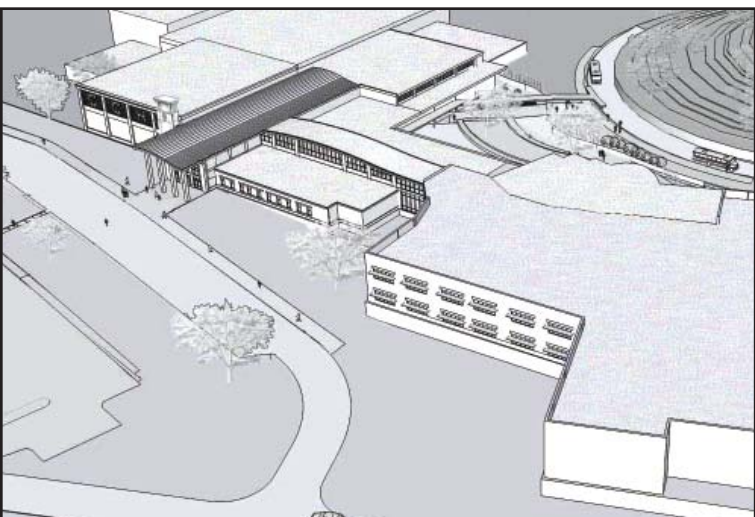
approximately 8.2 miles from a future 3rd High School site already owned by the district.

• We are currently conducting preliminary cost analysis of design concepts and stadium systems—to include program prioritization, while a design development committee made up of coaching staff and community members has been meeting and touring facilities.

• The Board of Trustees has hired Drymalla Constructors to perform the duties of construction management.

• Next up for the Board of Trustees is consideration of the design committee’s recommendations for the schematic layout and possible structural systems.

ored in May 2006 as the keynote speaker and the event was dedicated in her honor.

Through her passion for the theatre, she touched the hearts and lives of countless students, parents, coworkers, community members and young the-

atre students. In the history of Bastrop ISD, no building has ever been named after a person. “She (Wilhelm) was quite the light,” said Valerie Bullock, school board trustee, during the January school board meeting.

The Jerry Fay Wilhelm Center

for the Performing Arts will include a 1,500 seat multi-purpose auditorium, 300-seat black box theatre and a 100-seat multi-purpose rehearsal/conference room. The site for the center will be at the corner of Cedar Street and Chamber Street.



2008-09 FAFSA Application Available Online

Students that will be entering institutions that participate in the Federal Student Aid Program, beginning in the fall of 2008 are now able to complete the 2008 – 2009 FAFSA application online. The web address to begin the application is www.fafsa.ed.gov.

It is important to remember that there is not a fee to submit the FAFSA application. The FAFSA application is used by schools to determine a student's eligibility for Federal, state, and institutional financial aid. It is highly suggested that students submit the FAFSA as early as possible. The process is expedited when the FAFSA

is submitted electronically using a FAFSA PIN. Students and parents may apply for a FAFSA PIN by visiting www.pin.ed.gov. If parental information is being provided on the FAFSA application, then one parent will also need to electronically sign the FAFSA with their own PIN.

Having the following information is helpful in completing the FAFSA:

- Your Social Security Number and your parents' Social Security Numbers if you are providing parent information;
- Your driver's license number if you have one;

• Your Alien Registration Number if you are not a U.S. citizen;

• 2007 federal tax information or tax returns (including IRS W-2 information) for yourself (and spouse if you are married) and for your parents if you are providing parent information.

• Records of untaxed income, such as Social Security benefits, welfare benefits (e.g., TANF), and veterans benefits, for yourself, and your parents if you are providing parent information;

• Information on savings, investments, and business and farm assets for yourself, and your parents if you are

providing parent information.

It is important to note that if you have NOT yet filed a 2007 income tax return, you can still submit your FAFSA but you must provide as much income and tax information as you are able to present.

Help in completing the FAFSA is available at the Career Center located at Bastrop High School, room 205. Students may also seek help by contacting local community college and university Financial Aid offices. For further assistance please contact the Career Center at 512-332-0971.

Options and Requirements For Providing Assistance to Students Who Have Learning Difficulties or Who Need or May Need Special Education Services

If a child is experiencing learning difficulties, the parent may contact the person listed below to learn about the district's overall general education referral or screening system for support services. This system links students to a variety of support options, including referral for a special education evaluation. Students having difficulty in the regular classroom should be considered for tutorial, compensatory, and other academic or behavior support services that are available to all students including a process based

Response to Intervention (RtI). The implementation of RtI has the potential to have a positive impact on the ability of local education agencies to meet the needs of all struggling students.

At any time, a parent is entitled to request an evaluation for special education services. Within a reasonable amount of time, the district must decide if the evaluation is needed. If the evaluation is needed, the parent will be notified and asked to provide informed written con-

sent for the evaluation. The district must complete the evaluation and the report within 60 calendar days of the date the district receives the written consent. The district must give a copy of the report to the parent.

If the district determines that the evaluation is not needed, the district will provide the parent with a written notice that explains why the child will not be evaluated. This written notice will include a statement that informs the parent of their

rights, if they disagree with the district. Additionally, the notice must inform the parent how to obtain a copy of the Notice of Procedural Safeguards—Rights of Parents of Students with Disabilities.

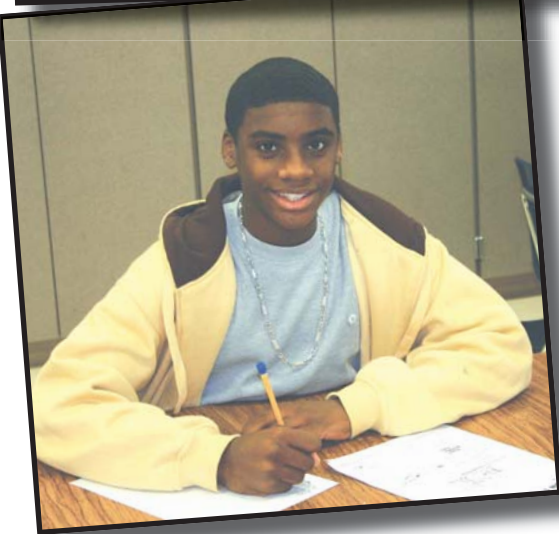
