## **COLLABORATING FOR CHILDREN**

It is to the benefit of our children, families, and staff to collaborate with an extensive network of agencies and individuals.

The professional staff of The 21st CCLC Program utilizes the help of many community groups. All of these groups focus on the healthy development of children, on providing the family ultimate support, and on advocating for safe environments for children.

Students from community colleges and universities may be assigned to the program to complete their teaching internships. In addition, student nurses and medical residents may come to observe healthy children at play.

Our staff also joins hands with the community and volunteers. All volunteers are carefully screened and trained for their “jobs” by the program’s administrators.

We have many community partners who have committed their services to improve The 21st CCLC Program and ensure that your child has the opportunity to experience all that our community has to offer. These partners include local businesses, service organizations, The Boys and Girls Club, and Sylvan Learning Center. A complete list of partners can be found at the back of this handbook.

Family members are encouraged to visit the campus frequently throughout the year. The partnership between 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC staff and the family is the most vital relationship of all.

## **POLICIES**

### Accidents/Incidents

If an accident occurs while a child is attending the program, the staff will assess the injury and take appropriate action. First aid boxes are kept at the site to deal with minor scrapes, cuts and bruises. If a more serious injury occurs which requires medical attention, 911 will be called and the parent will be notified. An accident/incident report will be prepared and a copy will be sent to the parent on all accidents/incidents.

### Attendance

Because each of our enrichment programs is curriculum based, it is vital that the children enrolled attend every day. While unforeseen illness or emergency will inevitably occur, more than 2 absences from any class will leave the student open to removal. Students with attendance of less than 80% will be subject to disenrollment. Attendance percentages will be more flexible at the High School due to other extra-curricular activities offered.

### Confidentiality

A Department of Education grant funds The 21st CCLC Program, The Department of Education requires that BISD provide information on our students for the purpose of assessing our program's effectiveness. The 21st CCLC Program staff will, at all times, protect the confidentiality of the families participating in our program. Any information received by our staff will be used only as necessary and only by approved Bastrop Independent School District personnel and according to District policy. In addition, our staff will protect the confidentiality of our participating families by protecting any other privileged information gained through conversations and/or written documents. No personal information will be released to outside entities without the expressed written consent of a parent and/or guardian.

### Discipline

Children attending The 21st CCLC Program will adhere to the discipline policy for the Bastrop Independent School District students during the core day. (See BISD Student Handbook).

Children whose behavior endangers others will be supervised away from other children. The child will have the opportunity to discuss the problem with a staff member and any other concerned party. If deemed necessary, the parent will be called to pick the child up for the day.

Guidance will always be positive, productive, and immediate when behavior is inappropriate. No child will be humiliated, shamed, frightened, or subjected to verbal or physical abuse while in the care of The 21st CCLC Program staff.

While our staff will make every effort to accommodate your child's needs, there may come a time when staff determines that the program will not be able to meet those needs. The 21st CCLC Program reserves the right to remove a child without use of the three steps listed below if the Campus Principal deems it appropriate.

Serious behavioral problems will be documented and the following actions will be taken:

- 1) 1<sup>st</sup> Offense - child counseled, note and phone call to parent;
- 2) 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense - child removed from class, counseled, and parent/teacher conference held before child returns to program;
- 3) 3<sup>rd</sup> Offense – child removed from program.  
Options will be available to prepare the child for re-entry into the program.

### Health

Our program operates for well children and staff only. Children who are mildly ill (e.g., minor cold symptoms) may remain at the campus only with an Administrator's approval. Children should be fully able to participate in all activities, including outdoor play. Parents should provide appropriate changes of clothing so children do not become either chilled or overheated. Light sweaters or jackets should also be made available.

Children with symptoms of communicable disease remain with a staff member until the parent or designated representative arrives for the child. We make every effort to reach the parents when a child is ill, but after 30 minutes we will call the emergency contacts indicated on the student enrollment form.

### **We will not serve children with:**

- A fever of 101 °F or above
- A fever of 100 °F if combined with another sign of illness
- A skin rash that has not been identified by a phone call or in writing from a physician who has seen the rash
- Diarrhea and/or vomiting two or more times in a day
- Evidence of head lice or other parasites
- Severe coughing
- Rapid or difficulty breathing
- Yellowish skin or eyes
- Pink eye
- Sore throat or difficulty swallowing
- Evidence of infection.

### **Children may be readmitted:**

- With a physician's statement that the child is free from communicable disease and that returning poses no risk to the child or others.
- If visibly free from communicable disease, fever free without benefit from fever reducing medications for 24 hours, and free of vomiting/diarrhea for 24 hours while on normal diet.

### Hours of Operation

Hours of operation may vary from campus to campus. Generally, the program is open from the dismissal of the school day until 5:30pm or 6:00pm, Monday through Thursday/Friday (***dependent upon your campus***). Check with your Site Coordinator for hours of operation). The program center will be closed on BISD holidays, early dismissal days, and bad weather days. The District fee-based program (STARS) will be available to elementary students on some of these days. Call 308-1601 for details.

### Late Pick Up:

**CHILDREN MUST BE PICKED UP ON TIME! Persistent late pick up will subject your child to possible removal from the program.**

### Medications

Medication will not be given during The 21st CCLC Program

### Nutrition

A nutritious snack will be provided each day by Bastrop ISD's Food Service Department. If a child's diet must be modified for health reasons, the parent must notify the center in writing and it must be included in the child's records. If a child's diet is modified for cultural reasons, the parent must notify the center in writing and may be asked to help provide supplemental foods.

### Parent Involvement

The 21st CCLC Program is built on the philosophy that parents must be involved in the child's education. Various parent involvement activities and parenting workshops will be available throughout the year. GED and ESL classes will also be available and support will be provided to help those parents seeking self-sufficiency. **Parents are required to attend at least two activities per year and are encouraged to attend all available activities.**

Parents may also be asked to serve on the 21st CCLC Program Task Force to help guarantee a setting that will reflect the needs of today's families.

If parents have concerns or need assistance with problems related to the program, they may discuss the issue with the Site Coordinator. If they are not satisfied, they may discuss their concerns with the Campus Principal or Program Director.

***Social and educational events are held throughout the year to promote interaction between staff and families and you are encouraged to attend.***

## Safety

We ask that parents closely supervise their children in hallways and parking lots when departing. We also ask that parents stay with their children at all times while on campus.

Parents or approved persons on the enrollment paper must come into the building and sign out their child each day. This is extremely important, since this list is used to check attendance during emergency drills or events. Children **will not** be permitted to leave with any person for whom the staff has not received written permission from the parent.

All employees are required by Texas Law to report any suspicion of child abuse or child neglect.

## Transportation

Bus transportation between school and home is provided on some campuses. Your Site Coordinator will inform you regarding transportation availability.
